USPBC leading business mission to Warsaw

March 1, Warsaw, Poland – The US-Poland Business Council (USPBC) will lead a delegation of eleven American companies to the Polish capital for a series of meetings with senior government officials on March 2 and 3. During the mission, participants will seek to promote and discover opportunities to increase their commercial cooperation with the Polish government and private sector.

The USPBC-led trip will represent the first visit of a large delegation of American businesspersons to Poland since the current government was sworn in just over 100 days ago.

“We hope that during this week’s mission, we will be able to find new ways to partner with Poland and bring the relationship between our two countries even closer,” said USPBC’s President, Eric Stewart. “I’m excited to meet the new government, hear about their economic priorities, and find mutually-beneficial projects to begin.”

Members of the delegation will attend meetings at ministries across the government and will be received by the Chief International Advisor to President Andrzej Duda. The U.S. Ambassador to Poland, Paul Jones, will also host a reception in honor of the visit and to promote closer economic ties between the United States and Poland.

The companies participating on the delegation are ADM, Amgen, Bell Helicopter Textron, Invenergy, Lilly, Owens-Illinois, Parsons, Raytheon, TE Connectivity, Textron Systems, and United Technologies Corporation.
